BCH Grant Funding

Funding projects and ideas that tackle healthcare issues close to home. Providing leadership and resources to improve the patient experience. The BCH Foundation focuses on what matters most, your health and your community.

BCH Department Grants

The Beatrice Community Hospital Foundation gave \$208,111 to nine BCH Departments through internal grant applications between October 1, 2022 and September 30, 2023. Equipment and supplies were purchased to support Beatrice Community Hospital staff in having access to the best technology to provide the best care for patients. Grants included the purchase of blood pressure cuffs, tourniquets, an endoscopy gastroscope, a portable ultrasound, a spot vision screener, artwork for the lobby of the new BFIM clinic, and a hearing screener. Infants up to the elderly were given new opportunities to receive more advanced care with the purchase of these new tools and supplies.

BCH Employee Crisis Fund

The Beatrice Community Hospital Foundation's Employee Crisis fund was first established in 1996. This fund provides a unique way in which employees may receive financial assistance during times of disaster, crisis, or personal hardship. This fund is not intended to replace, but to supplement resources in the community. A BCH employee who has been employed at the hospital for at least six months and is in good standing may receive financial assistance for one crisis during their employment at Beatrice Community Hospital. All requests are filtered through the Employee Crisis Committee, who make the final decision for approving requests for support through this fund.

A total of \$2,000 was granted to BCH employees between October 2022- September 2023 through the Employee Crisis Fund.

Patient Hardship Fund

From October 2022 to September 2023, the BCH Foundation worked with Case Managers and Clinic Supervisors employed at Beatrice Community Hospital to assist patients with the greatest financial need. Patients often have a single financial barrier that keeps them from attending clinic appointments, physical therapy, or diagnostic tests. The Patient Hardship Fund was developed to help families and individuals who need emergency assistance and are currently being treated by Beatrice Community Hospital. At the end of September 2023, more than \$1,400 from the Patient Hardship fund was granted to patients from the Beatrice Community Hospital. This assistance helped with everything from medication expense and equipment, to transportation and emergency lodging.

2023 BCH HEALTHCARE GRANTS

BCH Case Management - Self Monitoring Blood Pressure Devices

The BCH Case Management department received a BCH Foundation Healthcare Grant to purchase blood pressure devices for patients at-risk or diagnosed with hypertension. Case Management is a team that focuses on helping patients achieve their healthcare goals while managing chronic illness with a continued aim of detecting those at increased risk for readmission and complications. Along with receiving a blood pressure monitor, individuals are provided education on how to properly take their blood pressure and become familiar with the device prior to departing home. Once home monitoring data is received, providers can implement a solution that is best fit for the patient and helps to reduce the risk of heart attack, stroke, heart disease, and heart failure. This increased awareness of hypertension and improved management will reflect in decreased hospital stays and emergency room visits.




BCH Labor & Delivery - Hearing Screener

The BCH Labor & Delivery department received a BCH Foundation Healthcare Grant to purchase a new hearing screener to be used for state and federal mandated newborn screenings. This equipment is also necessary for ensuring appropriate development and wellbeing of newborn or pediatric patients, leading to early detection and intervention as necessary.

BCH Surgery Department - Endoscopy Gastroscope

The BCH Surgery department received a BCH Foundation Healthcare Grant to purchase a new endoscopy gastroscope to assist with the endoscopy services provided at BCH. This piece of healthcare equipment is used for internal imaging and allows the Surgery department to complete multiple procedures in one day while meeting industry standards and community demands.



BCH Infusion Center - Portable Ultrasound, iPad, & Midline IV Training

The BCH Infusion Center received a BCH Foundation Healthcare Grant to purchase materials for staff to provide midline catheters for patients that require long term intravenous access. This includes a new portable ultrasound, iPad, and training for staff. The Infusion Center treats over 4,500 patients throughout the year and approximately one third of those require IV access. Having intravenous access that is long term requires less IV insertions, which leads to decreased infection risk and less discomfort for the patient. This new technology also allows patients to remain close to home for their infusion treatments.

Beatrice Community Pantry and Emergency Services, Inc.

One in eight Gage County residents do not have consistent access to enough food, and over 1,200 of the county's youth qualify for free and reduced-price school lunches. The Beatrice Community Pantry and Emergency Services, Inc. requested a BCH Foundation Community Grant to aid in the relocation of their organization.

The mission of the Community Pantry is to help the people of Gage County access food and emergency services with dignity. While that mission will remain unchanged despite relocating, the pantry board acknowledges the rising incidence of food insecurity and how that impacts both the health and well-being of our community. The new space, which is now located underneath the city auditorium, is double the previous square footage and allows for safer, more equitable conditions for both volunteers and those being served.

Whispering Acres Tails & Treasures

Whispering Acres Tails & Treasures was awarded a BCH Foundation Community grant to make the buildings on site handicap accessible, expanding the opportunity to serve additional individuals. The programs at Whispering Acres High Hopes Equine Assisted earning (EAL) Center have been growing and expanding. Equine Assisted Learning is an educational program that is facilitated with individual or small group formats that focuses on activities with horses. Understanding and utilizing a horse's natural instincts allows individuals to create a form of experiential learning to help improve confidence, communication, leadership skills, and family dynamics. Most recently, an Adaptive Riding program was added to provide therapeutic horseback riding opportunities for adults and children with disabilities. This new program furthers the need for addressing the handicap accessibility on site.

Hope Crisis Center

The Hope Crisis Center was awarded a BCH Foundation Community grant to support the occupancy and maintenance of two emergency shelter apartments. Hope Crisis Center is a non-profit organization committed to empowering survivors of crisis center domestic violence and sexual assault as well as our communities through advocacy, education and confidential emergency services throughout Gage, Jefferson, Thayer, Fillmore, York, Seward, and Saline counties. Due to the large size of their jurisdiction, Hope Crisis Center has satellite locations in Beatrice, Fairbury, York, Seward, and Crete. All services provided are completely free, confidential, and available to all victims of abuse.

In 2021, Hope Crisis Center served 477 adults and 125 children. Of those served, 1 total of 1,232 shelter nights were provided. Confidential shelter is a lifesaving resource for those fleeing from volatile situations. Without a safe place to go during a crisis, many victims of abuse are forced to choose between violence and homelessness.

To ensure that this resource remains available in shortage areas, Hope Crisis Center launched the Building Hope Capital Campaign for Safe Shelter to support the purchase, renovation, and ongoing maintenance of a facility that features two secure apartment-style shelters, trauma-informed client spaces, and administrative offices.
