2 What do your donations support?

3 Reserved Parking

DON'T FORGET! Last year, the VIP Donor Parking spot became available for a very special employee donor each month! Here's how it works: Each quarter, we will draw a new winner for the parking stall each month. To be eligible for the drawing, you must be a current Employee Giving Campaign donor. What does "current donor" mean? It refers to anyone who has donated in the previous quarter.
